

ReBUILDing health systems in post conflict settings

Introduction

In countries affected by conflict, health systems often break down and emergency assistance often constitutes the main source of care.

As recovery begins, so should rebuilding the health system but little is known about how effective approaches are and research in this area has been neglected. Decisions made in early post conflict can set the long term direction of development for the health system.

ReBUILD focuses on health financing and human resources to identify opportunities that arise during the recovery from conflict. Our research will inform the development of pro-poor health systems to support the effective delivery of services to the poorest people.
